The pipeline project will endanger families and the environment and can cause damage to wells and septic systems. The worst thing is that we really have no idea how bad it can be.

The project will cause significant negative impacts to important waterways, critical habitat, farmlands, wetlands and forests, especially the Sourland Mountain region and its environs.

The proposed pipeline will uproot trees, contaminate quality topsoil, cut through existing water sources and inevitably damage existing successful farms and forests in our region. The route appears to target preserved land.
